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Questionnaires

A. Questionnaire for Research Students: The questionnaire begins with a brief note of introduction and the respondents are assured of confidentiality of their identities. The Questionnaire is divided into five parts or sections.

- i) The first section titled identification details consists of questions on discipline in Post-Graduation, area of research among other introductory questions on age, gender etcetera and disciplinary and institutional background.
- ii) The second section seeks to capture the process of training and capability formation, development of critical thinking and understanding of nuances of research by students. The role of post-graduation in research training, course-works of M.Phil and PhD programmes; selection of research topics, methodology, research agenda, and allocation of supervisors are some of the crucial issues involved with research training.
- iii) The third section seeks to capture the availability of academic and physical infrastructure and financial assistance/grants. The section seeks to capture awareness and experiences of students with respect to research facilities-infrastructure, scholarships and grants, and related support available to them from their institutions and other organisations.
- iv) The fourth section covers the awareness, aspirations, experiences and perceptions on various aspects related to academic publication and social utility of research. The section also tries to probe into the understanding of research quality.
- v) The fifth section is on socio-economic background of students. This last section seeks to bring out the factors influencing the motivation to pursue research by students.

B. Questionnaire for Researchers: This questionnaire also begins with a brief note of introduction and the respondents are assured of confidentiality of their identities. The Questionnaire is divided into seven parts or sections.

- i) The first section consists of questions on identification details –age, gender etcetera and disciplinary and institutional background.
- ii) The second section seeks to capture the process of training and capability formation. The role of research training ranging from university education to workshops; efforts to upgrade skills by the researchers and institutional support are some of the crucial issues involved with training and capability.
- iii) The third section seeks to capture the availability of academic and physical infrastructure and financial assistance/grants. The section tries to elicit awareness and perceptions of researchers related to these elements of research environment.
- iv) The fourth section covers the experiences with sponsored research projects and perceptions on different related aspects. A major portion of research carried out by professional researchers is constituted by sponsored research projects.

- v) The fifth section covers the awareness, perception and aspirations of researchers on dissemination of research. The section also tries to probe into the understanding of research quality.
- vi) The sixth section seeks to capture aspects and factors related to research collaborations through experiences and perceptions of researchers.
- vii) The seventh section tries to focus on the peculiarities of the profession of researchers.

C. Questionnaire for Teaching Faculty: This questionnaire is similar in nature as the questionnaire for researchers. The first six sections of this questionnaire and a good number of questions are identical with the one discussed above. But the questions are modified according to the working conditions prevalent in universities. The seventh section tries to capture the experiences of teaching and doing research together.

Checklist for Key Informant Interview (KII)

The checklist for KII consists of questions aimed at the organisations. These questions seek to locate the organisations in the macro policy environment. The issues covered are- workforce, competition, collaboration, funding, regulatory regimes, services or products and related issues.

Jawaharlal Nehru University (SSS-D): It is a public university funded by the Union Government. Established in 1969, the university has created a niche for itself in Indian academia. A university declared as University with Potential for Excellence by the UGC, has received the highest grade by the National Accreditation and Assessment Council (NAAC) in India. This is a research university which focuses mainly on post-graduation education and research. The School of Social Sciences in SSS-D is one of the largest schools. Four centres of the School are receiving the SAP grants from the UGC as Centre for Advanced Studies. The university has maintained its pan-Indian character through appropriate measures to address the socio-economic diversity of the country.

University of Calcutta: One of the oldest universities in India, it is a State Government funded university. Established in 1857, the university has produced the initial intelligentsia of the country and influenced the freedom struggle. A university having the distinction of producing Nobel laureates has undergone many transformations since its beginning. A pioneer in many fields, this affiliating university struggles for funding and to cope with the socio-political environment.

Jadavpur University: One of the reputed State universities, it was formally set up in 1955. Though established after independence, the university is associated with one of the oldest engineering colleges in India. The University, an emerging centre for excellence, has also been the centre for socio-political movements as its teachers and students have been associated with these activities.

Christ University: A missionary college was declared as a private deemed to be a university in 2008. The institution is trying to place itself as a secular academic institution. The Social Sciences (Economics and Psychology) are placed among a host of professional courses.

Central University of Hyderabad: A public university funded by the Union Government is known for its large science schools. Schools of Social Sciences and Economics form a smaller part of the university which is declared as a University with Potential for Excellence. Established in 1974, this university provides integrated courses along with regular under graduate and post graduate courses. Though located in South, this university attracts a considerable number of students from other parts of India.

National University of Educational Planning and Administration: This deemed university funded by the Ministry of Human Resource Development of the Union Government has a long history of being a think-tank before becoming a deemed university in 2006. It is a premiere centre for research and capacity building in education and carries out these activities for the Government. It provides capacity building services to practitioners from states and other countries. As it started as Asia Regional centre of the UNESCO and works closely with the Ministry, it presents a unique case of research for policy making.

National Institute of Public Finance and Policy: The National Institute of Public Finance and Policy (NIPFP) is well known for research in public economics and policies. Founded in 1976, the institute is an autonomous body sponsored by the Ministry of Finance of the Union Government and various State Governments. It undertakes research, policy advocacy and capacity building. The institute has emerged as a premier think tank in India, and has made significant contribution to policy reforms at all levels of the government. It has developed linkages with other teaching and research institutions both in India and abroad.

Institute of Development Studies, Kolkata: It is a think-tank funded by the Government of West Bengal. Founded in 2002, the institute offers M.Phil and PhD programmes in Development studies in collaboration with the University of Calcutta. The teaching and research is interdisciplinary in nature. The institute works in the areas related to economic and human development. It has been able to secure funding from the ICSSR under a new scheme for research institutes.

Deshkal Society: This NGO works in the areas of education, land rights and sustainable livelihoods since 1995. They organise seminars and conferences regularly on these issues. Collaboration with academicians and international agencies helps this NGO in engaging with research. They publish bulletins and maintain online discussion forums. Headquartered in New Delhi, this NGO works mostly in Northern and Eastern parts of India.

Arghyam Foundation: This foundation undertakes and sponsors research in the areas of drinking water and sanitation. They work with NGOs, academicians and government departments. They publish bulletins and organise workshops and round-tables related to water use, technology and other related issues. Based in Bengaluru, they are connected to NGOs working on water and sanitation in almost all parts of the country.
